








Our Mission

Access Top French Universities

- The Lafayette Fellowship will fund one year of master's-level study at France's most prestigious academic institutions for 30 American students.
- The Fellowship is open to both Francophone and non-Francophone candidates across STEM, the humanities, social sciences, and the arts.

Fellowship Benefits and Funding

- A €1,500 monthly stipend
- One year of tuition for eligible programs at a partner French institution.
- Application fee waivers
- Student visa fee waivers
- A round-trip flight to and from France
- Coverage of travel costs and activities related to the French-American Leadership Program

- Lafayette Fellows will receive mentorship support and be paired with prominent French public figures.
- Lafayette alumni will gather annually in one of the 10 U.S. cities where Villa Albertine has a presence.
- The Lafayette Fellows will become "ambassadors" of France and Europe and serve as key drivers of the French-American friendship for decades to come.



Selection Process



Core Profile

Academic excellence (minimum 3.7 GPA), strong leadership potential, a commitment to social impact, and a genuine interest in France.

• 4 Local Selection Committees

West Coast, Midwest, South, & East Coast to ensure geographical diversity.

A Final Jury

Chaired by Dr. Esther Duflo and including prominent academics and scholarship experts (e.g., IIE, Fulbright, Posse).



Calendar

End of August - End of November 2025	Application period
December 2025 - January 2026	Selection process: pre-selection and online interviews
February 2026	Final jury and announcement of laureates
July 2026	Arrival in France, reception at the Elysée, launch of the French-American Leadership Program
Fall 2026	Start of master's-level programs
June 2027	"Au-revoir" ceremony at the Quai d'Orsay



Eligibility Criteria



- Be under the age of 27 (as of July 1, 2026)
- Be in possession of a bachelor's degree from a U.S. institution (completed between January 2023 and June 2026), with a GPA of no lower than 3.7.
- Knowledge of French is not required for acceptance into the Fellowship program.



Required Application Materials



Application materials include:

- Transcript
- Cover letter
- Resume
- Personal statement in a video format
- Three letters of recommendation (two academic and one extracurricular)

The awarding of the scholarship is conditional upon admission to one of the partner institutions.
